Girt

- 1. To make tight and strong by binding; to put on. To clothe; to dress; to habit. To furnish; to equip. To surround; to encircle; to enclose; to encompass.
- 2. To be made ready for instant, immediate action.

Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness . . .

Gird, Girt, Girded

That which must be done to ready a man for extreme exertion

The Three Girtings of Scripture

First, Christ was Girt for the Cross

The LORD reigns, he is clothed with majesty; the LORD is clothed with strength, wherewith he hath girded himself: the world also is stablished, that it cannot be moved.

Psalms 93:1

Second, we must be Girt with Christ

I clothed thee also with broidered work, and shod thee with badgers' skin, and I girded thee about with fine linen, and I covered thee with silk.

Ezekiel 16:10

He riseth from supper, and laid aside his garments; and took a towel, and girded himself. After that he poureth water into a basin, and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel wherewith he was girded.

- To be ready to Share the Gospel
- To be ready to Give Answer for the Hope we have Within
- To be ready to Defend the Truth
- To be ready to Rescue the Weak
- To be ready to Give Everything for the sake of Christ
- To be ready to Suffer for the Glory of our King
- To be ready to Bear a Cross
- To be ready to be Stripped
- To be ready to be Scourged
- To be ready to be Crucified
- To be ready to Die that the testimony of Christ's Love might be proclaimed

And Even More Specifically, What are we Being Girt For?

- To be ready, if our God asks, to wake up at 3:00am and pray, like we've never prayed before
- To be ready, if our God asks, to give up food for the day and fast
- To be ready, if our God asks, to testify of Jesus Christ to a stranger at the local coffee shop
- To be ready, if our God asks, to give away our entire savings account to someone He shows us
- To be ready, to expect God to ask, to ask God to ask, and to diligently listen for God to ask us to do something that is not easy

The initial evidence that the prayer work is finished

The Position of Faith

Utter confidence that the rain is back in Israel

The inevitable outcome of real working faith

The Position of Faith is always After the Test of Faith

The Position Patience of Faith

And Saul said to David, You are not able to go against this

Philistine to fight with him; for you are a youth, and he a man of
war from his youth. But David said to Saul, Your servant used to
keep his father's sheep, and when a lion or a bear came and took a
lamb out of the flock, I went out after it and struck it, and delivered
the lamb from its mouth; and when it arose against me, I caught it
by its beard, and struck and killed it. Your servant has killed both
lion and bear; and this uncircumcised Philistine will be like one of
them, seeing he has defied the armies of the living God. Moreover
David said, The LORD, who delivered me from the paw of the lion
and from the paw of the bear, He will deliver me from the hand of

you! So Saul clothed David with his armor, and he put a bronze

Ready and in Position

Girt Waistline - check. Oil in the Lamp - check. Faith tested and proven - check. Lock-jawed and immovable in the Position of Faith - check. Goliath is going down - check.

The Passover Lamb

And thus shall ye eat it; with your loins girded, your shoes on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and ye shall eat it in haste: it is the LORD'S passover.

The Checklist for Facing the Impossible

- Blood of the Spotless Lamb on the outside Doorpost check
- Girt Waistline, running shoes on, staff in hand check
- Spotless Lamb in the Digestive Track check
- Proof of God's Power and Faithfulness, seeing Him sustain us and protect us throughout
 10 horrible plagues check
- Indomitable, immovable confidence that though the mighty Egyptian calvary may follow, seeking to destroy us. And though a great red sea seem to blockade us from forward progress. And though we be hemmed in by formidable mountains on either side without possibility of escape we have in our backpacks a lock-jawed resolute faith that our God will make a way check.

Pray God to send a few men with what the Americans call "grit" in them; men, who: when they know a thing to be right, will not turn away or aside, or stop; men who will persevere all the more because there are difficulties to meet or foes to encounter; who stand all the more true to their Master because they are opposed; who, the more they are thrust into the fire, the hotter they become; who, just like the bow, the further the string is drawn the more powerfully it sends forth its arrows, and so the more they are trodden upon, the more mighty will they become in the cause of truth against error.
