The Facts of the Natural Law

Now when the Egyptians had overtaken the Hebrews, they prepared to fight them, and by their multitude they drove them into a narrow place; for the number that pursued after them was six hundred chariots, with fifty thousand horsemen, and two hundred

thousand foot-men, all armed. They also seized on the passages by which they imagined the Hebrews might fly, shutting them up between inaccessible precipices and the sea . . . The Hebrews . . . if they should have thought of fighting . . . had no weapons; they expected a universal destruction, unless they delivered themselves up to the Egyptians. So they laid the blame on Moses, and forgot all the signs that had been wrought by God for the recovery of their freedom; and this so far, that their incredulity prompted them to throw stones at the prophet, while he encouraged them and promised them deliverance . . . But Moses, though the multitude looked fiercely at him, did not, however, give over the care of them, but despised all dangers, out of his trust in God . . . he said, ". . . it is no better than madness, at this time to despair of the providence of God."

The Facts of Heavenly Law

Thou art not ignorant, O Lord, that it is beyond human strength and human contrivance to avoid the difficulties we are now under; but it must be Thy work altogether to procure deliverance to this army, which has left Egypt at Thy appointment. We despair of any other assistance or contrivance, and have recourse only to that hope we have in thee; and if there be any method that can promise us an escape by thy providence, we look up to thee for it. And let it come quickly, and manifest thy power to us; and do thou raise up this people unto good courage and hope of deliverance, who are deeply sunk into a disconsolate state of mind. We are in a helpless place, but still it is a place that thou possesses; still the sea is thine, the mountains also that enclose us are thine; so that these mountains will open themselves if thou commands them, and the sea also, if thou commands it, will become dry land. Nay, we might escape by

a flight through the air, if thou should determine we should have that way of salvation.

Bewildering Excellence in all Six Arenas

- 1. God. A Heaven-come-earth devotional life with his God (Biblical Study and Prayer)

God has an Ethic by which He works

God is not a man, that he should lie; neither the son of man, that he should repent: hath he said, and shall he not do it? or hath he spoken, and shall he not make it good?

The 11 Ethics of God's Work

- 1. If He starts a work, He finishes it.
- 2. He does His work with Joy.
- 3. He is compliant and submissive to His Boss, accepting the most difficult tasks without question.
- 4. He stays alert, focused, and on task sober-minded always. He does not grow tired or weary.
- 5. He Controls His Tongue.

- 6. He seeks another's wealth. He works not for applause, notoriety, and/or promotion. He treats others as more important than Himself.
- 7. He ceases labor and rests only at the appropriate time.
- 8. He does His work right. He does everything with unparalleled excellence. He is the best in His field.
- 9. He is marked by perfect integrity without spot or blemish.
- 10. He is persistent and will overcome every obstacle in order to complete the job.
- 11. He gives attention to detail, noticing the small things.

`atsel - ä·tsāl'

Slothful, Sluggard, the one of justified sleep, the man who lives for sleep and repose, the man paranoid of hard work.

The Lesson of the Sluggard

I went by the field of the slothful, and by the vineyard of the man void of understanding; And, lo, it was all grown over with thorns, and nettles had covered the face thereof, and the stone wall thereof was broken down. Then I saw, and considered it well: I looked

upon it, and received instruction. Yet a little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to sleep: So shall thy poverty come as one that travels; and thy want as an armed man.

Eight Signs of the Sloth

1. He Pines for His Bedsheets

How long wilt thou sleep, O sluggard? when wilt thou arise out of thy sleep?

Proverbs 6:9

As the door turns upon his hinges, so does the slothful upon his bed.

Proverbs 26:14

2. He Irks his Employers and thus struggles to keep a job

As vinegar to the teeth, and as smoke to the eyes, so is the sluggard to them that send him.

Proverbs 10:26

3. He Can't figure out why his life never works

The soul of the sluggard desires, and has nothing: but the soul of the diligent shall be made fat.

Proverbs 13:4

4. He is Mystified why his efforts are always blocked

The way of the slothful man is as a hedge of thorns: but the way of the righteous is made plain.

Proverbs 15:19

5. He Always Has a Reason for why he can't work hard today

The sluggard will not plow by reason of the cold; therefore shall he beg in harvest, and have nothing.

The slothful man saith, There is a lion in the way, I shall be slain in the streets.

6. The Slothful man is pathetic

The slothful hides his hand in his bosom; it grieves him to bring it again to his mouth.

8. The Sluggard thinks himself more brilliant than those around him

The sluggard is wiser in his own conceit than seven men that can render a reason.

Introducing the Diligent

Charuwts - Khä·rüts'

sharp, pointed, refined (as gold), diligent, Spiritually toned and ever-ready for exertion

He who has a slack hand becomes poor, But the hand of the diligent makes rich (Proverbs 10:4) . . . The hand of the diligent will rule, But the lazy man will be put to forced labor. (Proverbs 12:24) . . . The soul of a lazy man desires, and has nothing; But the soul of the diligent shall be made rich (Proverbs 13:4) . . . The plans of the diligent lead surely to plenty, But those of everyone who is hasty, surely to poverty (Proverbs 21:5) . . . The slothful man roasts not that which he took in hunting: but the substance of a diligent man is precious [prized] (Proverbs 12:27) . . . See thou a man diligent in his business? he shall stand before kings; he shall not stand before unknown men (Proverbs 22:29).

Mary-Working

Jesus-Boating

100% exertion, finding 100% rest in the Father's direction, 100% confidence in the Father's outcome, knowing with 100% assurance that the winds and the waves bow to the Father's authority, and knowing with 100% certitude the position we have in the Father.
